Huntington Beach is once again preparing for its Fourth of July Celebration which will start early with a parade and end with a dazzling fireworks display. Fireworks are enjoyable and exciting to watch, but each year illegal fireworks injure thousands of people, many of them children, and cause thousands of fires.

The Huntington Beach Fire and Police Departments want to ensure the safety of all its residents during the Fourth of July holiday. They remind you that it is illegal to manufacture, possess, store, sell, and use fireworks in the City of Huntington Beach. This includes so-called "safe and sane" fireworks purchased outside of the city or on the Internet. Civil citation fines have increased to \$500 for the first offense and \$1000 for additional offenses. By enforcing this code strictly, the Huntington Beach Police and Fire Departments will be hard at work on the Fourth of July to keep our city safe. "There are no safe fireworks," stated Huntington Beach Fire Chief Duane Olson. "Fireworks are dangerous and illegal in the City of Huntington Beach. If

you are caught using or possessing fireworks, of any kind, you will be fined. It is not worth the risk and the safety of your family and friends."

Fireworks are especially dangerous to children—even those that you may consider to be relatively safe, like sparklers. Sparklers can burn at temperatures of 2,000 degrees—hot enough to melt some metals—resulting in the majority of injuries to children under the age of 5. More than 50 percent of fireworks-related injuries occur to children and teenagers under the age of 14.

"If you want to celebrate the Fourth of July with a fireworks display, the best way to do that is by attending the public fireworks display conducted by professional pyrotechnicians," said Huntington Beach Police Chief Ken Small. Anyone witnessing illegal fireworks or those in possession of fireworks is asked to call the Huntington Beach Police Department at (714) 960-8825.

The Huntington Beach Fourth of July celebration features the largest Independence Day parade west of the Mississippi River. This year's parade will include more than 300 entries including bands, floats, film and television celebrities, local dignitaries, equestrians and community groups. If your past holiday tradition has been to set off illegal fireworks, it is time to start a new one. The Fourth of July fireworks display at the Huntington Beach Pier is an annual tradition in the community. After the sun sets, thousands of fireworks will be launched from the Huntington Beach Pier. The safe and exciting professional display will amaze visitors of all ages. As always, this is a free event.

AlertOC is a mass notification system designed to keep Orange County residents and businesses informed of emergencies and certain community events. By registering with AlertOC, time sensitive voice



messages from the County or City in which you live or work may be sent to your home, cell or business phone. Text messages may also be sent to cell phones, e-mail accounts and hearing impaired receiving

devices. Registration is web-based and must be completed via the internet. Instructions are easy to follow and users may register their home and business information. Friendly Visitors visit with senior clients who have limited social contact. Volunteer Escorts work through the transportation program to assist frail seniors on their errands, shopping or to the doctor's office.

Whether you plan to volunteer in the senior community or care for an aging loved one, this class prepares volunteers and caregivers to better serve seniors. The Age Wave is an expected 64% increase in the senior population over the next few years. In Huntington Beach, there will be 53,000 seniors who are parents, neighbors, friends and loved ones. Artsy Sunday in July




On July 12, the HBAC will host a free family workshop as part of

Drought Tolerant Demonstration Garden at the Central Library

If you have been to the Central Library recently, you might have noticed the transformation of the medians and the parking lot into beautiful gardens! A wide variety of drought tolerant grasses, trees and plants have been planted so residents can learn more about the beauty and appeal of plants that do not require much water.



50 – 70% of our potable water consumption is used for irrigation purposes. With present drought conditions in the Colorado river watershed and the Sierra mountains, as well as predicted future climate changes, it makes sense to replace high water demand plants and turf grass with plants that require much less water. Hopefully the demonstration gardens will serve as inspiration to unleash residents' creativity in designing their own low water use gardens!


Huntington Beach History Video and Book Available

Whether you're a history buff or just love the City, a history of Huntington Beach book and video are now available that every resident will enjoy. The last 100 years comes to life in the film produced by the City, Surf City Centennial: 100 Years in Huntington Beach. It shows the City's roots including its Native American discovery, its founding in 1909 by Henry Huntington, the oil boom of the 1920's and the beginnings of surfing with Duke Kahanamoku.

The book, Ebb and Flow, presented by the City's Historic Resources Board, is a printed version of the amazing historical exhibit featured in February at the Huntington Beach Art Center.

Free Used Oil and Filter Disposal for Residents

Are you a "do-it-yourself" mechanic who needs to dispose of used motor oil & used oil filters? Then take advantage of our Used Oil & Oil Filter collection program. You can arrange for pick-up at your home by calling our residential "curbside" collection service at 1-800-449-7587, or you can drop off used oil and filters at most area auto

parts stores where you buy your new oil; look for the blue and yellow "Used Oil Collection Center" logo in the store's window or call 1-800-CLEANUP (1-800-253-2687) for the nearest location. The service is free to local residents, funded by a grant from the California Integrated Waste Management Board.

The City's Used Oil & Oil Filter collection program collects over 1,000 gallons per year from residential pick-up service, and another 15,000 gallons per year from drop-off locations at auto parts stores and auto service centers, keeping it from being illegally disposed and ending up on our streets, on our local beaches, or in our wetlands.
