HUNTINGTON CENTRAL PARK (HCP)

Huntington Central Park is the city's largest park, consisting of over 350 acres. Park entrances can be found on Edwards Street, Golden West Street, Gothard Street, Slater Avenue, and Talbert Avenue. The park provides a quiet retreat from the usual city turmoil. A sense of serenity is felt as one strolls amidst the trees, expansive lawns, and placid lakes and observes a variety of bird life. Additionally, the park has picnic tables, barbecues, restrooms, several playgrounds, disc golf, and six miles of trails. Covered Group Picnic Shelter – Seats 200 people and includes tables, barbecues, sinks, and electricity.

Amphitheater – Small rustic Amphitheater which seats 200 people and includes wooden benches, a stage, and electricity.
