Communication from Councilmember Debbie Cook transmitting the following **Statement of Issue**: Under current City Municipal Code, Chapter 5.64, Section 5.64.110 (b), the city sets a limitation of \$1,000 on the portion of the proceeds from a lawful bingo game that can be used to cover administrative expenses such as rental of property, and purchase of equipment, etc. A copy of Chapter 5.64 is attached.

The Huntington Beach Elks Lodge #1959 has requested that the allowable administrative expenses be increased from \$1,000 to \$2,000. This would bring the city's code into alignment with current State laws regulating bingo.

Since our code has not been amended since 1993, it seems reasonable to make this minor change. To that end, I make the following motion:
