A Declaration of Policy about Children and Young Adults

- The citizens of Huntington Beach recognize that our children are our future.
- In all deliberations citizens understand that each young person is unique and born into circumstances influenced by genetics, economic factors, social and cultural differences, family structure and dynamics.
- Strong families are the most effective means of rearing children who feel secure, loved and supported as they move through the challenges of early childhood, middle school and high school.
- Providing safe and secure neighborhoods, homes and schools in which youth and families can flourish is an important civic responsibility.
- Promoting strong academic programs within the City of Huntington Beach recognizes that quality schools benefit children and families, as well as the quality of life in the community.
- Facilitating positive alternative activities for children and young adults demonstrates that prevention is a priority in Huntington Beach.
- The citizens of Huntington Beach recognize the impact of positive role models that demonstrate good character, sportsmanship and citizenship.
- Demonstrating that children and youth are an important part of the community clearly establishes that they are valued.
- Together, the city of Huntington Beach and its citizens proclaim that the needs of children will be included as a priority in all planning and policy decisions that come before the City Council, Planning Commission, and city departments.
