

## DESCRIPTION OF "OUR HOME TOWN" CALANDER PICTURES!

COVER PICTURE Steel beams at intersection of Main St. & Ocean Blvd. (now known as

Pacific Coast Highway) Built in 1930!

JANUARY The first Huntington Beach pier. A 1,000 foot timber structure built in

1904. Nearly destroyed by a winter storm in 1912.

FEBRUARY The first Huntington Beach Union High School, built in 1904. Picture

taken in 1912.

MARCH 1906 Train (Engine #2215) sunk in peat bogs. It took 5 days and 5 nights

to get it uprighted!

APRIL Street scene -Main Street, heart of old downtown, early 1920's.

MAY 1920, looking southwest at oil derricks around Central Grammer School

before there was a Palm Avenue!

JUNE Late 1930 view from beach toward Pacific Coast Highway, notice old

"Golden Bear" building, torn down during the redevelopment of H.B.

JULY 1917 - Enjoying a 4th of July band concert on the beach!

AUGUST The "Helene Home" with their Home and Furniture Store behind it.

Located at 6th and Walnut Street. Built in 1916.

SEPTEMBER The new Huntington Beach High School, located on Main St. Built 1920.
