Dear Allison,

The location of the Rip Curl Mixed-Use Development project site, southwest of the San Diego Freeway (405) and between Gothard Street and the Southern Pacific Railroad right-of-way, at 7302-7400 Center Avenue, Huntington Beach, California (Newport Beach 7.5' Quadrangle, NE 1/4, SE 1/4, SW 1/4, section 14, T5S, R11W), is on surficial sediments composed of Quaternary (Holocene) alluvium and colluvium (Qac), as determined from the information plotted on the Geologic Map of Orange County, California, showing Mines and Mineral Deposits (California Division of Mines and Geology, Bulletin 204, Plate 1, by P. K. Morton and R. V. Miller, 1981). The only LACMIP invertebrate fossil localities on record that are in the general vicinity of this project site are in the Pleistocene marine deposits along the coastal areas to the west, south, and southeast. These deposits primarily crop out in the vicinity of Seal Beach, Sunset Beach, Huntington Beach (including LACMIP localities 436, 17427, 21491, 23655, 23656, and 23657), and Newport Beach - Newport Bay (including LACMIP localities 487, 17005, 22831, 31322, and 40007). Because the project site is only about 1.25 miles north of the closest mapped outcrop of Pleistocene marine terrace deposits (near Warner Avenue in Ocean View), it is possible that this unit may be present in the shallow subsurface at the project site. The LACMIP collections also have numerous invertebrate fossil localities in the Tertiary (Miocene and Pliocene) marine strata in the areas directly adjacent to Newport Bay and to the east, but these outcrops of older fossiliferous units are more than 9 miles away from the project site.

Assuming the excavations do not penetrate into Pleistocene marine deposits or older bedrock, and because none of the Quaternary (Holocene) surficial sediments (Qac) in this area is known to be fossiliferous, it is unlikely that any fossil invertebrates will be disturbed during construction at this site. However, if Pleistocene marine terrace deposits or older bedrock are encountered during construction, then the situation changes and there would be a higher probability that invertebrate fossils could be found. There is always some chance that fossils of freshwater or terrestrial invertebrates and vertebrates could be found in the Quaternary (Holocene) surficial sediments (Qac) at this site. The LACMIP collections do not have any invertebrate fossils from the Rip Curl Mixed-Use Development project site or its immediate vicinity.

Dear Allison:

I have conducted a thorough search of our paleontology collection records for the locality and specimen data for the proposed Huntington Beach Rip curl Mixed-Use Development, in the City of Huntington Beach, Orange County, project area as outlined on the section of the Newport Beach Sur USGS topographic quadrangle map that you sent to me on 10 December 2007. We do not have any vertebrate fossil localities that lie within the project boundaries, but we do have localities nearby from the same sedimentary units that may occur as subsurface deposits in the proposed project area.

The entire proposed project area has surficial deposits composed of younger Quaternary Alluvium. These deposits usually do not contain significant vertebrate fossils, at least in the uppermost layers, and we have no vertebrate fossil localities anywhere nearby from such deposits. Our closest vertebrate fossil locality from similar deposits is LACM 4018, situated west-northwest of the proposed project area at the intersection of Warner Avenue and Golden West Street, that produced specimens of invertebrates, reptiles, birds, rodents, horses and deer in peat between four and eight feet below the surface, but these specimens were later determined to be of very late Holocene age. Both due west and to the southeast of the proposed project area, however, on mesas higher in elevation there are deposits of older Quaternary sediments that probably occur in the proposed project area at unknown depth. Our closest fossil vertebrate localities from these older Quaternary deposits are LACM 7657-7659, situated west-southwest of the proposed project area along Ellis Avenue east of Beach Boulevard, where sediments from well cores over 100 feet below the surface produced fossil shark and fish specimens including soupfin shark, *Galeorhinus galeus*, skate, *Raja*, ray, *Myliobatis*, angel shark, *Squatina californica*, cusk eel, *Otophidium*, toadfish, *Porichthys notatus*, queenfish, *Seriphus politus*, sculpin, *Leptocottus*, goby, *Lepidogobius lepidus*,

and sanddabs, *Citharichthys sordidus* and *Citharichthys stigmaeus*.

Surface grading or shallow excavations in the proposed project area are unlikely to uncover significant fossil vertebrate remains. Deeper excavations in the proposed project area that extend down into older Quaternary terrace deposits, however, have a good chance of encountering significant vertebrate fossils of Late Pleistocene (Quaternary) age. Therefore, any substantial excavations in the proposed project area should be monitored closely to quickly and professionally recover any fossil remains discovered while not impeding development. Any fossil materials uncovered during mitigation activities should be deposited in an accredited and permanent scientific institution for the benefit of current and future generations.

This records search covers only the vertebrate paleontology records of the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County. It is not intended to be a thorough paleontological survey of the proposed project area covering other institutional records, a literature survey, or any potential on-site survey.


The Native American Heritage Commission was able to perform a record search of its Sacred Lands File (SLF) for the affected project area (APE). The SLF search did indicate the presence of Native American cultural resources in the immediate project area.

Early consultation with Native American tribes in your area is the best way to avoid unanticipated discoveries once a project is underway. Enclosed is the name of the nearest tribes that may have knowledge of cultural resources in the project area. In particular, we recommend that you contact David Belardes at (949) 493-0959 and the other persons on the attached list of Native American contacts may have knowledge as to whether or not the known cultural resources identified may be at-risk by the proposed project. The Commission makes no recommendation of a single individual or group over another. It is advisable to contact the person listed; if they cannot supply you with specific information about the impact on cultural resources, they may be able to refer you to another tribe or person knowledgeable of the cultural resources in or near the affected project area (APE).

Lack of surface evidence of archeological resources does not preclude the existence of archeological resources. Lead agencies should consider avoidance, as defined in Section 15370 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) when significant cultural resources could be affected by a project. Also, Public Resources Code Section 5097.98 and Health & Safety Code Section 7050.5 provide for provisions for accidentally discovered archeological resources during construction and mandate the processes to be followed in the event of an accidental discovery of any human remains in a project location other than a 'dedicated cemetery. Discussion of these should be included in your environmental documents, as appropriate.

As per your request received on December 12, 2007, a records search was conducted for the above referenced project. The search includes a review of all recorded archaeological sites within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site as well as a review of cultural resource reports on file. In addition, the California Points of Historical Interest (PHI), the California Historical Landmarks (CHL), the California Register of Historical Resources (CR), the National Register of Historic Places (NR), and the California State Historic Resources Inventory (HRI) listings were reviewed for the above referenced project site. The following is a discussion of the findings.

Due to the sensitive nature of cultural resources, archaeological site locations are not released.

***Newport Beach and Seal Beach, CA. USGS 7.5' Quadrangles***

**ARCHAEOLOGICAL RESOURCES:**

No archaeological sites have been identified within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site. No sites are located within the project site. This does not preclude the potential for archaeological sites to be identified during project activities. No isolates have been identified within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site. No isolates are located within the project site.

## **HISTORIC RESOURCES:**

A review of the historic maps – Las Bolsas and Santa Ana (1896) 15' USGS - indicated that in 1896 there were two improved roads and three structures within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site.

The California Point of Historical Interest (2007) of the Office of Historic Preservation, Department of Parks and Recreation, lists no properties within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site.

The California Historical Landmarks (2007) of the Office of Historic Preservation, Department of Parks and Recreation, lists no properties within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site.

The California Register of Historical Places (2007) lists no properties within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site. These are properties determined to have a National Register of Historic Places Status of 1 or 2, a California Historical Landmark numbering 770 and higher, or a Point of Historical Interest listed after 1/1/1998.

The National Register of Historic Places (2007) lists no properties within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site.

The California Historic Resources Inventory (2007) lists no properties that have been evaluated for historical significance within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site.

## **PREVIOUS CULTURAL RESOURCES INVESTIGATIONS:**

Five studies (OR1\*, OR1673, OR2297, OR2689, and OR3326) have been conducted within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site. Of these, one is located within the project site. There are nine additional investigations located on the Newport Beach and Seal beach 7.5' USGS Quadrangles that are potentially within a 1/2-mile radius of the project site. The reports are not mapped due to insufficient locational information.  
*(\* = Located within the project site)*

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

According to our records, the project site has not been subjected to any (recent) studies and the current cultural resource sensitivity of the project site is unknown. The only previous report (OR1) was conducted in 1973, and is considered out of date. Current surface conditions do not appear to allow for an adequate survey of potential surface or sub-surface cultural artifacts. Although the project occurs in an area where the surface and subsurface appears to have been previously disturbed, there is still potential for buried prehistoric and / or historic resources within the project boundaries. Therefore, in order to avoid damaging any previously unidentified cultural resources, an archaeological monitor should be in place for ground-disturbing activities.

It is also recommended that any historic properties (45 years old and older) in the area of potential effect be identified, recorded, and evaluated for local, state, or national significance prior to the approval of project plans.

Finally, it is recommended that the Native American Heritage Commission should be consulted to identify if any additional traditional cultural properties or other sacred sites are known to be in the area.

The professional consultant you retain may request the records search map, archaeological site records, and bibliography from the Information Center referencing the SCCIC number listed above for a fee (per the fee schedule). Any resulting reports by the qualified consultant should be submitted to the South Central Coastal Information Center as soon as possible.
