Subject: Continuing safety issue related to Brethren Christian field Light.

Mr. Hess,

I am once again contacting your office regarding the continuing safety and compliance issues associated with the field lights at the Gisler school site (Brethren Christian High School).

My neighbors and family have had to enduring the negative impact of the non-compliant field lights for every single night time event held at BCBS in calendar year 2008 and 2009 (all games held in 2008 and now 4 out of 4 2009 games). The 2008 football games were all held prior to the city even approving the permit to allow night time games!

Exactly when does the city plan to enforce the CUP that was issued to BCBS. Is the city going to wait until a resident or pedestrian is injured or killed by a light blinded driver? From Mrs Jone's experience, clearly BCBS can not control the " lost guest patrons" driving up and down our residential streets trying to find access to the field. They are like moths drawn to a flame"! I have had similar experiences of football patrons driving down my " light filled" cul de sac searching for an access point to the field!

Why was code enforcement unable to "enforce" a clear violation of the CUP. How many letters, phone call and appearance's before council will it take before the city does something to enforce this CUP and protect the safety of the residents?

I personally addressed the council last month with photos documenting the safety and compliance issue of "light glare" from the BCBS field. As documented by Mrs Jones' photos, the light glare issue was worse last Friday (October 23). On Oct. 7th Rami Talleh (city staff) assured me that

BCBS would be brought into compliance. When a situation gets worse, despite the applicants "attempts to come into compliance", this is not progress! It is my understanding that California has a "3 strikes law". BCBS now has 8 strikes! Is the city prepared to turn its back on the residents and allow BCBS a full 12 strikes?

Can you please reply to this email, and provide me the exact procedures the city follows regarding the enforcement of a CUP. There are 3 remaining games on the calendar for 2009. It is my hope the city will enforce the CUP prior to the end of another football season. If not, I will look forward to our future communications throughout the remainder of 2009 and into the 2010 season.

Thank you for your time, interest and consideration of my concerns.


Dear Mr. Bogart,


Mr Flanagan,




Please find attached photos taken last night (11/6/2009) to document the continued non-compliance of BCHS regarding both the number of field lights and the light spillage onto adjacent residential streets and properties. BCHS had 10 portable lights plus the 4 permanent light standards illuminating the fields at last nights game. The CUP clearly states they are allowed 4 portable lights for the field illumination. In addition to exceeding the allowed number of lights, the field lights continue to create glare and light spillage onto the adjacent streets and residential properties. This light spillage continues to create a safety issue for both pedestrians and drivers in the area.

Thank you for having a code enforcement officer on site last night. I did speak with Mike (Fuentes ?) on site last night. We specifically discussed the number of allowed portable lights and the light spillage issue onto the adjacent residential properties. Mike heard our concerns. He indicated he would be writing his report, as the prior code enforcement officers have done previously, and he will submit his report to the department head for review.

Based on Mr. Kelley's correspondence, it is my understanding that BCHS is now at risk of revocation of the CUP. Since BCHS has failed to achieve compliance (regarding the lights) , I am asking your staff, and the City of Huntington Beach, to revoke the CUP allowing for night time football games at his location. The neighbors have had to endure 2 full years (football seasons) of this lack of compliance. BCHS has chosen to violate the CUP during every night time event they have held on the fields. The city has allowed ample notice and opportunities for BCHS to come into compliance. Once your office has reviewed the reports and made a decision, I request some sort communication regarding the status of the permit.


To: HB Mayor and City Council and Mr. Hess, Mr. Flanagan and Mr. Kelley,



Please find attached photos taken the on the night of October 2/2009. These are photos taken of the spillage from the temporary field lights Brethren Christian High School is utilizing for the night time football games allowed under the conditional use permit issued by the city of Huntington Beach.

The CUP #08-052 specifically states (item #4h): "All Field lighting shall be oriented so as not to produce glare on adjacent residential properties."

The attached photos were taken on Indigo Circle. Both single story and two story homes had direct "glare" onto the residential homes.

Additionally, the GLARE from these lights creates a significant safety hazard. As you can see from the 2 street view photos, the glare form the lights is BLINDING to any driver coming down Indigo Circle. I did not include photos of other streets in the neighborhood, but Red Jacket Circle and Effingham Street had the same issue with Glare from the field lights.

I would like a response from your office as soon as possible regarding the city of Huntington Beach's plans to enforce this very clear violation of the CUP #08-052. I am concerned for the safety of the children and residents of the neighborhood.

BCHS has 4 more "home games" on the schedule (Oct 9, 23 and Nov 6 and 13). As a resident of Huntington Beach, it is my expectation the the city will enforce the restrictions placed on this applicant and there will be no further issue with "light spillage" on any of the future scheduled dates for BCBS football.

SUBJECT: Request for information regarding next football game light and traffic mitigation measures

The next scheduled football game is this coming Friday, October 23, 2009.

The timing of events is as follows:

5:00 pm: signs stating that there is no football game parking in the neighborhood are in place

5:30 pm: six traffic control officers are in place to direct traffic to onsite parking

5:45 pm: field lights (both portable and "city") are turned on

6:30 pm: game starts

9:00 pm: game is over, begin shutting off portable lights

9:30 pm: "city" lights are turned off

10:00pm: all lights are off, field clean up completed

It is our understanding that the Code Enforcement Officer who observed the game on October 9 found that we were in compliance with the CUP lighting requirements. In order to reduce further complaints we are implementing the following lighting glare mitigation measures: We will reduce the number of portable lights from 13 to 11. This eliminates the light at the entrance to the field parking at the north end of the back driveway. We will make sure that the lights which illuminate the field they are pointed even lower than last week. We will adjust the concession area lighting to only to illuminate the area at least 10 feet

west from the east fence line. If you have any questions, please call me at the above number.

We received this Notice of Violation from the City of Huntington Beach Code Enforcement today.

We explained to Tim Flanagan that the violation #2 is incorrect. The limit of four lights refers to the four permanent light standards. Bob Ransom noted that the key word in the actual CUP findings is "installed". The line in the violation that says "No more than four portable lighting units are permitted to be used for the football games."

Tim says that he personally thinks the glare is excessive, especially on Red Jacket (north of the school). And that it made driving on Red Jacket unsafe and exposes us to liability. (Odd that the previous inspector said everything looked fine and that he had been in all the cul-de-sacs.)

On the south side of the field we can point the lights in a north easterly and north westerly direction instead of due North, we will have to position them more toward the goal line. We will also angle them down to the ground more dramatically.

Tim says that we need to show progress in resolving this problem. If the problems are not corrected we would be issued a \$250 citation for each violation but that he would not shut us down.

Bob is writing a response as to what our corrective actions are and Kevin is contacting Jason Kelly to resolve the misunderstanding regarding the four light standards.


Scott,
