B. PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS

Commissioner Pinchiff recused himself on Item No. B-1 due to the proximity of his residence to the project location and left the room.

B-1. ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT NO. 14-001/ LOCAL COASTAL PROGRAM AMENDMENT NO. 14-002 (DTSP – DISTRICT 1 ON-SITE ALCOHOL SALES)

Applicant: City of Huntington Beach Request: ZTA: To amend the Downtown Specific Plan (DTSP) to limit the hours of alcohol sales to 10:00 PM Sunday through Thursday and 11:00 PM Friday and Saturday, with food service allowable until midnight, for new or expanded eating and drinking establishments in District 1 of the Downtown Specific Plan. LCPA: To amend the City's certified Local Coastal Program Implementing Ordinance (IP) to reflect Zoning Text Amendment No. 14-001. Location: Downtown Specific Plan – District 1 (Downtown Core) City Contact: Jennifer Villasenor, Acting Planning Manager

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Motion to:

- A. "Approve Zoning Text Amendment No. 14-001 with findings (Attachment No. 1) and forward the draft ordinance (Attachment No. 2) to the City Council for adoption."
- B. "Approve Local Coastal Program Amendment No. 14-002 with findings (Attachment No. 1) and forward the draft resolution (Attachment No. 3) to the City Council for adoption."

The Commission made the following disclosures:

- Commissioner Bixby attended the City Council meeting that began this project, read through the emails and the late communication packet.

Jennifer Villasenor, Acting Planning Manager, gave the staff presentation and an overview of the project.

There was a brief discussion regarding the enforcement of the proposed amendments.

There was a brief discussion regarding the alcohol sales conditions for the nearby Pacific City development.

THE PUBLIC HEARING WAS OPENED.

Dianne Thompson, Chairman of the Board for the Chamber of Commerce, spoke in opposition to Item No. B-1 citing the potential consequences for new businesses and those with existing alcohol licenses.

Brett Barnes, representing Huntington Beach Downtown BID and Duke's and Sandy's restaurants, spoke in opposition to Item No. B-1. He indicated that Police Department enforcement of current regulations should be sufficient and expressed concern that the proposed amendments would benefit the nearby Pacific City development and penalize any new restaurants in the downtown area.

Susan Welfringer, Huntington Beach Downtown BID, spoke in opposition to Item No. B-1. She noted that the Police Department is working with current downtown businesses to enforce good business practices and noted that the proposed amendment could have a negative effect on new downtown businesses.

Steve Daniel, BID president and owner of Rocky Mountain Chocolate Factory, spoke in opposition to Item No. B-1. He asked that the Police Department be allowed to enforce current regulations. He noted that the Downtown Task Force did not discuss or recommend this amendment.

Bruce Miliken, Longboard Restaurant, spoke in opposition to Item No. B-1, citing concerns with potential consequences of different regulations for Pacific City and the downtown area.

WITH NO ONE ELSE PRESENT TO SPEAK, THE PUBLIC HEARING WAS CLOSED.

There was a brief discussion regarding the differences between conditions of approval imposed on the Pacific City project and the proposed text amendment for District 1.

There was a brief discussion regarding the potential negative impacts to attracting new businesses to District 1 and to the success of those potential new businesses.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY FRANKLIN, SECONDED BY BIXBY, TO APPROVE ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT NO. 14-001 AND LOCAL COASTAL PROGRAM AMENDMENT NO. 14-002 WITH FINDINGS AND FORWARD THE DRAFT ORDINANCE TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR ADOPTION, BY THE FOLLOWING VOTE:
