**G. ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS** – The Community Services Department has received a request to place buoys in Huntington Lake in Central park to define a course for RC Sailboats. The sailing of RC (remote control) boats is currently allowed per Municipal Code 13.48.120. Commission is being asked to consider allowing the placement of temporary course buoys for RC sailboats in Huntington Lake in Central Park for a trial period of six (6) months.

**Recommended Action:** Approve the placement of temporary buoys in Huntington Lake in Central Park to create a course for RC sailboats for a six (6) month period.

**Alternative Action:** Do not approve the placement of buoys in Huntington Lake in Central Park and direct staff on how to proceed.

**H. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS** – In an effort to keep commission informed, the following are updates on major projects/issues:

H1. LeBard School/Park - On May 5, 2014, City Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Huntington Beach City School District (HBCSD) for development of portions of LeBard School and LeBard Park. The MOU outlines the development process to redevelop the building and blacktop portions of the school site with single family homes, while keeping the ball fields utilized by SeaView Little League in place. Staff will provide updates as well as a revised park master plan for Commission review at a future meeting.

H2. New Senior Center – Staff is continuing to work on completing the plans and specifications for the new senior center in Central Park. In the next few months, City Council will consider funding sources for the project, which may include a combination of Infrastructure Fund, General Fund, capital campaign/donations and bond issuance options. Per the current schedule, staff anticipates bidding the project in early fall with construction commencing in late fall.
