1. Report of HRTF Donation account balance  
Kuhnke reported account balance as follows: \$1791.64 HBHRTF Misc. Account

2. Hate Crime Report: No report by Sgt. Smith due to absence.

Note: Nees requested that the Task Force review the coordinated letter developed by CSP staff, the Police Department, and Kuhnke to confirm that individuals of hate crimes won't receive duplicative letters.

3. Report of OC Human Relations News/Activities

Chair Inouye passed around the annual hate crime report prepared by the O.C. Human Relations Commission. Summary: Known perpetrators, young adults, white males. Annual report will be presented on October 18<sup>th</sup> to Huntington Beach City Council. Parent Leadership Institute (PLI) is listed in annual report as advocacy group.

Coordinating Council meeting had 107 people in attendance.

Jackle reported on [www.buildfutures.org](http://www.buildfutures.org) education/awareness organization that informs on increased homelessness in our communities. The homeless population grew drastically in Orange County in the last few years. There may be potential networking opportunity from coordinating council with the HBHRTF in the future.

**VII. Updates, Planning, and Possible Motions pertaining to the following events/programs:**

1. Report of HRTF Student Representative Programs, Education Committee Report

Chancellor met with students from Westminster and Huntington Beach High Schools on October 4th. Goal is to have 2 representatives from each of the 7 high schools in Huntington Beach. Marina High School has prospective student interested in joining group. Student representative group is growing.

Chapman University Holocaust Education Center visit was attended by Bill Nees, Don Garrick and Alan Chancellor. They met with the museum coordinator to facilitate their visit through the Center. This Center is similar to the Museum of Tolerance in Los Angeles however not as expansive. Holocaust Education Center focuses on 1945-1946 WWII era. Material is presented differently from LA's Museum of Tolerance. Question of what the best perceived age may be for the attending audience. Group felt potential of this program is very favorable with different possibilities of using Chapman's Holocaust Education Center. This program appears to

be a viable program to pursue. One concern is financial cost, the largest expense would be paying substitute teacher. In the past this was \$120.00 a day. Minimum number of students is 7 maximum 14. Interested in rolling field trip out November 3, 2010. November 1<sup>st</sup> will be the next Education Committee meeting.

2. Report of HB Reads book selection activities

HB Reads event date is March 24<sup>th</sup>. Fundraising Goals is \$20,000. Previous Barnes and Noble book fair raised \$600. Christina Rodriguez will phase out as liaison from the Task Force to HB Reads. Karen Jackle and Joe Dagley will continue to attend HB Reads meetings as representative from the task force.

3. Update of activities associated with National Hispanic Heritage month scheduled for October 13, 2010 Garrick reported the location to be the Barnes and Noble Bella Terra. This event supports the HBReads kick-off and coincides with their fundraiser (10/13/10-10/15/10).

Garrick also reported that Ron Gonzales will write story in "Latino Notebook" Section of O.C. Register Thursday 10/7/10. Other recommendations for advertising include "El Pueblo".
