**DECEMBER DONATION UPDATE**

The Huntington Beach Neighborhood Watch Program (HBNW) **fiscal year** is from July 1 to June 30 each year. We have estimated we will need approximately \$25,000 this year to cover the various HBNW program expenses which include, but are not limited to, newsletter assembly, distribution costs, returned postage, mailing labels, etc. From the start of our fiscal year to now, we have received **\$7,889.95 in donations and newsletter advertisements-- we have \$17,110.05 to go** by June 30, 2012. The HBNW Board thanks you and our advertisers for your support and generous donations. A \$6 donation pays for each subscriber's distribution costs; a \$10 donation helps with these costs and other needed expenses and puts your name in the Newsletter as a contributor; and a \$25 or more donation accomplishes the above, plus you will receive a HBNW sticker and a token of appreciation. Remember, HBNW is a non-profit organization; **donations are tax deductible.**




- 1) I will lock and secure all my doors and windows when I leave my residence even if I am just walking to a neighbor's house.
- 2) I will lock and secure my vehicle at all times even when it is parked in front of my home or in my garage.
- 3) I will not leave items visible in my vehicle including gym bags or cell phones.
- 4) I will check my home for adequate lighting in the front, back and sides.
- 5) I will check that my shrubs are cut down so criminals cannot hide behind them.
- 6) I will request a free copy of my credit report from the 3 major credit reporting agencies, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. I will check it for any discrepancies. By ordering from one of the 3 agencies every 4 months you can check your credit report 3 times throughout the year.
- 7) I will write down the serial numbers of all identifiable property (including bicycles, tools or machinery) and/or video all my belongings including jewelry.
- 8) I will contact the HBPD Community Relations Specialist to learn what is needed to coordinate a Neighborhood Watch Block Meeting on my street or in my community. I will get my neighbors involved in setting up annual meetings.
- 9) I PROMISE TO REPORT ALL SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY TO THE HUNTINGTON BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT (or the local Police Department if I am in another city.)

## Preventing Impaired Driving In Your Community

Alcohol and other drug (AOD) impaired driving is a prevalent issue in the city of Huntington Beach. According to the Huntington Beach Police Department (HBPD), there were 398 alcohol-related collisions in the city during 2010. However, much is being done in the community to help prevent AOD impaired driving. Organizations such as Community Service Programs (CSP)-Project PATH, Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) and the HBPD have ongoing efforts in the community to help eliminate this preventable problem.



The HBPD recently received a grant to provide additional funding for impaired driving enforcement efforts. This grant is issued by the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The money received will go towards activities such as License/Sobriety Checkpoints and Saturation Patrols.


CSP-Project PATH has been working in the city to prevent impaired driving through education, training and community collaboration. They work with HBPD to provide educational materials to drivers who pass through Driver's License/Sobriety Checkpoints. PATH staff also provide educational workshops to Golden West College students and community members on alcohol, how it affects the body, and current DUI laws. Lastly, they provide free Responsible Beverage Service training to bars and restaurants in the city to teach managers/bartenders/servers how to serve alcohol responsibly.

MADD provides a variety of services, including impaired driving prevention, underage drinking prevention, and victim services for those affected by impaired driving. In addition, MADD will hold their annual "Walk like MADD" event in the city of Huntington Beach on **May 12, 2012**. This event serves as MADD's biggest fundraiser of the year. Come show your support for MADD by participating in this year's event.

You can also help prevent impaired driving by planning ahead. Designate a sober driver or have enough money for a taxi. If you see an impaired driver on the road, call 911 immediately. Provide a description of the car, the location and how the car is being driven. Every step taken will help reduce impaired driving and save lives.

The Huntington Beach Police Department (HBPD) recently had the privilege of honoring its volunteers at it's Annual Appreciation Holiday Luncheon. The luncheon was held at Don the Beachcombers, in Huntington Beach, and the cake was provided by Great Dane Baking Company also in Huntington Beach.

We presently have 3 volunteer groups (approximately 150 volunteers) providing assistance and services to the HBPD and our community. If it wasn't for our volunteers, we would not be able to provide you with many of the services listed below:

**HB Neighborhood Watch Board (HB N/W) and Newsletter Assembly Group:** They oversee the Neighborhood Watch program; planning activities, events and meetings throughout the year with the focus on crime prevention, education and awareness. They conduct Neighborhood Watch Block meetings, assist at special events throughout the community, and much more. The Newsletter Assembly Group meets monthly to collate and prepare the Neighborhood Watch Newsletter for mailing and distribution. To date they have prepared over 1 million issues.

**RSVP:** Provide vacation house checks, assist at the main station front desk, work in the Detective Bureau, Crime Lab, Budget & Payroll Department, remove illegally posted signs, work at our sub-stations, assist at special events, assist the Neighborhood Watch Board and Newsletter Assembly Group, give Police Department tours, visit elementary schools, distribute vehicle burglary and theft prevention information through the Curb Crime Program, and much more.

**VIPS:** Provide assistance at our sub-stations, work in the Detective Bureau, the Gang Unit, Records Bureau, Budget & Payroll Department, assist the Neighborhood Watch Board and Newsletter Assembly Group, work special events at schools and throughout the

community, assist with the Curb Crime Program and much more.

All the hours that are dedicated to providing services to the Police Department and this community are volunteer hours; therefore the time they commit is free. As stated earlier, we would not be able to provide many of these services without these men and women because of the cost the city would incur.

If you see one of our volunteers out in the community, at one of the Police Stations, distributing the HB Neighborhood Watch Newsletter, etc., please take the time to stop and tell them thanks for their service and all they do to help keep Huntington Beach a safe place to live, work and play in.
