DUI Checkpoint Nets 2 DUI Arrest and 10 Citations for Unlicensed/Suspended Drivers

The Huntington Beach Police Department conducted a multi-location Sobriety and Drivers License checkpoint on Saturday, February, 2014 from 7:45 PM to 2:30 AM. Two of the checkpoints were set up on arterial roadways and one on a secondary roadway. Checkpoints are placed in locations that have the greatest opportunity for achieving drunk and drugged driving deterrence and provide the greatest safety for officers and the public.

Sobriety/Drivers License checkpoints help lower DUI related deaths and injuries. A major component of these checkpoints is the deterrent effect it has on those who might drive drunk and/or drug impaired, unlicensed, or with a suspended/revoked license. Checkpoints help to bring more awareness to motorists and encourage everyone to use sober designated drivers.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), checkpoints have provided the most effective documented results of any of the DUI enforcement strategies. Here are some of our statistics from Saturday's checkpoint:

- 711 Vehicles through the checkpoint
 700 Vehicles screened for DUI and drivers license
 8 Standardized Field Sobriety Tests

 administered

 1 DUI- Alcohol impaired suspect arrested
- 1 DUI- Alcohol and medication impaired suspect arrested

- 1 Warrant arrest for previous DUI
- 9 Citations for driving while unlicensed
- 1 Citation for driving on a suspended license
- 0 Vehicles impounded
- 7 Citations for various Vehicle Code violations

Huntington Beach Police Department will be conducting another Sobriety/Drivers License Checkpoint on April 11th, 2014, in our ongoing commitment to lowering deaths and injuries upon our streets and highways.
