Airshow Parking Info

A general parking lot will be set up at Goldenwest Street and Ellis Avenue, approximately two miles south and west of the 405 Freeway. From the general parking lot, shuttles will take visitors to Show Center, which features exhibits from companies like The Boeing Company, Ford, Suzuki and other companies along with an extensive food court. Show Center is located at Beach Blvd. and Pacific Coast Highway.

Cost is \$35 per car and shuttle to and from the beach is included. Pre-sale daily passes are available at <http://events.goground.com/airshow>. This discounted price is available until October 10.

Shuttle will run Friday, October 21 through Sunday, October 23 from 7:30am to noon and from 4pm – 8pm. During the show times, the shuttles will run at various intervals depending upon need.

City Manager's Report

PUBLIC WORKS

Fiscal Year 2016/17 Capital Improvement Program

On September 6, 2016, the City Council approved the FY 16/17 CIP budget in the amount of \$24.4 million for new capital projects. The primary funding sources for the CIP are revenue funds and enterprise funds such as water, sewer and street funds. In addition to those funds, \$3.6 million is being allocated from the City's General Fund, \$1.2 million from the Infrastructure fund, and approximately \$400 thousand from the Park Fund. City staff also works aggressively to acquire grant funding for capital projects as reflected in approximately \$3.6 million in grant funding. In the next few weeks, city staff will be revising the interactive CIP Map on the City's website, so residents can view and learn more about the proposed projects. Huntington Harbour

Approximately 670 feet of 16-inch HDPE waterline in Huntington Harbour is complete. The new pipe is necessary to improve redundancy and reliability. The City had the opportunity to construct this project along with the County of Orange's Main Channel Harbour Dredging Project.

This unique collaboration allowed the City to take advantage of the cost of mobilizing a dredging contractor to dredge a trench area in the harbour for the City waterline, thereby reducing project costs and conserving on staff time and resources.

COASTAL DEVELOPMENT PERMIT NO. 16-015 (BAILEY RESIDENCE): To permit the conversion of vaulted ceiling area above a family room into a 546 sq. ft. bedroom and conversion of a bedroom on the second floor into a 210 sq. ft. family room in an existing 4,445 sq. ft. single-family dwelling. The project is located at 16482 Barnstable Circle, Huntington Beach, CA 92649 (at the terminus of Barnstable Circle). Please contact Christopher Wong for more information.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 16-026 (RIIP BEER BREWERY AND TASTING AREA): To establish a craft beer brewery with an approximately 855 sq. ft. indoor tasting area and a 271 sq. ft. outdoor tasting area for the sale, service, and consumption of craft beer (ABC Type 23 License). The project is located at 17216 Pacific Coast Highway, 92649 (north of Warner Ave. and east of Pacific Coast Highway). Please contact Kimo Burden for more information.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 16-027 (RIIP BEER PATIO): To permit the on-site sale, service, and consumption of craft beer (ABC Type 23 License) within a proposed 216 sq. ft. outdoor patio area in conjunction with an existing craft beer supply store located at 17214 Pacific Coast Highway, 92649 (north of Warner Ave. and east of Pacific Coast Highway). FIRE DEPARTMENT

Huntington Beach Power Outage

On September 28, at 6:20 a.m., approximately 3,700 homes and businesses were left without power after multiple underground transformers caught fire. The outage affected residents in the vicinity of Golden West Street south of the I-405. City officials were notified immediately and Public Works and the Fire Department personnel responded to the affected area, assessed the situation, and mitigated any risk to public safety. Within a few hours, power was restored to most of the affected area with the exception of 319 residents who did not have power for nearly 24 hours.



Due to power concerns throughout Southern California, City officials have taken proactive measures and have held two meetings with Southern California Edison management. The goal of these meetings was to ensure the highest quality of service for the residents and businesses of Huntington Beach.

Trending In Your Area



Throughout the city there has been an increase in thefts of registration paperwork and insurance cards from vehicles. We recommend that registration and insurance cards/documents are no longer stored in unattended vehicles. With that said, please remember that those documents are needed while the vehicle is being driven. You can take a picture of your registration and insurance on your cell phone. Make sure you can read everything on the documents. If you are pulled over or involved in an accident, the picture of this information is sufficient proof of these items.

Even with the limited information on these documents, identity theft is still possible. Other examples include using the legitimate VIN and information to apply for and get new plates. With the new plates, the suspects will put them on another vehicle. They will then use the vehicle for personal use or attempt to sell the vehicle to unsuspecting buyers.

A more sophisticated operation will use the legitimate VIN and place a new VIN plate on another vehicle (most likely stolen). Again, they will either use the vehicle for personal use or sell to unsuspecting buyers.

New Parking Equipment Installed at Main Promenade Parking Structure

The aging and outdated parking equipment purchased back in the mid 90's has been replaced at the city's downtown parking structure. The new modern parking equipment consists of four ticket dispensers, three automated cashier readers, and a pay station, located in the lobby entrance to Main Street. Community Services Department is excited that it will help provide accuracy, speed, and customers service to the public parking structure as it provides daily service to over 1,500 customers per day.



Bartlett Park Improvement Project

As part of the Parks & Recreation Master Plan approved by the City Council and Community Services Commission, improvements to Bartlett Park have been set in motion. Restore HB volunteered their time to clear the trails and install lumber and rocks to border the upper trail and the trail along Coldwater Lane. As part of the Day of Service, the Greater Huntington Beach Interfaith Council installed lumber and decomposed granite



along the lower trails near Yorktown Avenue. Removal of the fencing at Bartlett Park began on Friday, September 23. The chain-link fence along Coldwater Lane, as well as Yorktown Avenue will be removed and replaced with lodge pole fencing. Other improvements to Bartlett Park include the resurfacing of the parking lot, a new trash enclosure, and three new monument signs.

Recreation Hours at the City Gym & Pool

You may have visited the City Gym & Pool to participate in a class, but did you know that we also have open hours for you to enjoy our facility? The gymnasium, pool, and game room all have their own hours where you can come in and make the most out of what the City Gym & Pool has to offer!

Our gymnasium has specific hours allotted for Open Volleyball, as well as Full Court Basketball. Full Court Basketball is held on Tuesdays from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Open Volleyball takes place on Fridays from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Times for both sports may vary depending on class schedule. Feel free to call us at (714) 960-8884 to get the open gym times for the day.

We host a number of swim lessons and aquatic exercise classes in the pool, but also have recreation swim hours for just \$2 per swimmer. Recreation Swim takes place on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. for all ages and 8 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. for adults only. We also host senior swim hours on Fridays from 1:30 p.m. to 3 p.m. Swimmers are welcome to use our locker room facilities to shower and store personal belongings.

When the gymnasium and pool are occupied by scheduled classes, the game room is open Monday-Saturday from 9 a.m. until the building closes. The game room is home to two pool tables, table tennis, and even a foosball table. It hosts plenty of seating for friends and family members to relax while you play. Feel free to check out game equipment from the office in exchange for collateral (keys or picture ID).
