Why Prepare a Consolidated Plan?

In exchange for receiving HUD funds, recipients must prepare four things:

1. A Five-Year Consolidated Plan
2. Annual Action Plan
3. CAPER
4. Assessment of Fair Housing



Purpose of the Five-Year Consolidated Plan

- Help us identify housing and community development needs, priorities and strategies;
- Help us indicate how state and federal funds will be allocated to address these needs and activities over five years
- Annual action plan sets actions for 1st yr.



Consolidated Plan Planning Process

- Analysis of quantitative and qualitative data regarding need
- Public involvement and other agency input about need
- Development of strategies in response to identified needs

- Housing Market Analysis
- Housing & Homeless Needs Assessment
- Housing and Community Development Strategic Plan
- Goals, Objectives, and Strategies for Plan























Total Permits by Unit Type









Housing Problems - Hispanic Population





