**Request:** To review the potential environmental impacts associated with the construction of a natural treatment system in the northeastern corner of Central Park located on the eastern side of Goldenwest Street. The project would divert up to 3 million gallons per day (mgd) of dry weather flows from the East Garden Grove Wintersburg Channel (EGGWC) into a constructed wetlands for treatment. The constructed wetlands would be located in the northeastern corner of Central Park (between Slater Avenue and Talbert Avenue to the north and south, and Goldenwest Street and Gothard Street to the west and east). Components of this portion of the proposed project include wetland “trains” through which flows would move through a series of natural treatment processes into a restored Talbert Lake. A wetland “train” would be a linear feature consisting of alternating wetland and open water areas that would act as a system to incrementally remove pollutants as flows traverse the length of the feature. Project objectives include the improvement of water quality and the potential beneficial reuse of treated water on site for park irrigation purposes if sufficient water is available. The capacity of the diversion facilities is proposed for up to 3 mgd.
