

**CITY OF HUNTINGTON BEACH PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT
OVERLOAD PERMITS
RULES AND REGULATIONS**

I. Permits are required:

- A. When the **length** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 65 feet.
- B. When the **width** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 8 feet 6 inches wide.
- C. When the **height** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 14 feet high.

II. Pilot cars are required preceding the load:

- A. When the **length** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 80 feet long but does not exceed 108 feet in length.
- B. When the **width** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 12 feet wide but does not exceed 14 feet wide.
- C. When the **height** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 14 feet 6 inches high but does not exceed 15 feet 6 inches in height.

III. Pilot cars are required front/rear and the Huntington Beach Police Department **must** be notified prior to having the oversized load in the City.

- A. When the **length** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 108 feet in length.
- B. When the **width** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load is greater than 14 feet wide.
- C. When the **height** of the vehicle and/or combination vehicle and load exceeds 15 feet 6 inches high.
- D. The Huntington Beach Police Department **shall** be notified by calling (714) 960-8809, before operating on the City streets.

IV. Special Provisions:

- A. Other than the requirements listed in this document, the permittee shall follow the State of California, Department of Transportation, Transportation Permit Manual.
- B. Over weight vehicles require copies of State and County overload permits, as well as a specified route plan.
- C. The fee for a single trip permit shall be \$16.00 (for a maximum of 3 days, no extensions).
- D. The fee for an annual permit shall be \$90.00. Each vehicle shall be required to have its own original permit on the vehicle (including cranes). No photocopies will be accepted.
- E. Before an overload permit will be issued, insurance must be approved by the City Attorney's Office and on file with the Risk Management Division. For any questions on insurance matters, please contact Justin Wessels or Heather Campbell at (714) 536-5252 or fax information to (714) 374-1597.
