Virginia Clara: Reported on recent Oak View Renewal Partnership collaborative events offered in the Oak View Community. She stated that the OVRP grant is coming to an end, and summarized results of a community survey that was recently disseminated.

Jessica Escalante: Reported on a successful Halloween event at the Oak View Family Resource Center, as well as a Christmas event in partnership with Mariners Church which served over 200 families.

### **E. CITY STAFF REPORTS**

1. **Code Enforcement:** Erik Tlilayatzki introduced Devin Michaelis, who has also been assisting in the Oak View area. Tlilayatzki reported that he continues to work with Fair Housing to educate and inform residents. He also reported that he is working with property owners regarding illegal dumping, and is hoping for improvement. Discussion ensued regarding size of bins required for each property and frequency of service.
2. **Community Services Department:** Chris Slama thanked Virginia Clara and the OVRP for their years of service to the Oak View Community.
3. **Office of Business Development:** Denise Bazant reported that the Community Development Block Grant program for fiscal year 2018/2019 has begun, and applications can be found on the City's website.
4. **Library Services:** Claudia Locke summarized various upcoming programs such as a free OCTA Transportation Workshop and the Lego Club. She announced that the Oak View branch recently replaced all computers, and that the Literacy Program will be training tutors in January, 2018. More information for all programs and events can be found on the City's website.
5. **Police:** Lieutenant Ferrin reported that there has been an increase in gang activity in the area as well as some violence. HBPD continues to address the concern, and has created gang specialist positions to get out in the community. HBPD held a successful Spanish Citizens Academy and reunion in collaboration with Oak View Renewal Partnership and Mariners Church.
6. **Public Works:** Doris Powell announced that residential and commercial trash service will be delayed by one day during the weeks of December 25<sup>th</sup>, and January 1<sup>st</sup> due to the holidays. Republic Services will be picking up Christmas trees and cardboard boxes January 2nd through January 12<sup>th</sup>. Powell reported that there will be an e-waste collection at the Central Library parking lot January 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. The Public Works Department will offer a fix-it clinic in the upcoming months, and dates will be announced later.
7. **City Manager's Office:** Antonia Graham reported that the installation of LED street lights throughout the City is almost complete. She introduced Dr. Jack Brouwer to discuss UC Irvine's Advanced Energy Community Project Update.
