Katherine Johansen: Reported on recent upgrades to the Solteros Apartment properties, and expressed concern about the need for neighboring properties to make improvements. Johansen stated that she had recently been cited by Code Enforcement and has since remedied the issues. She discussed her concerns with other Code Enforcement issues on other properties, as well as the need to continue the illuminating of the streets.

Jessica Escalante: Provided programming updates regarding the Oak View Family Resource Center, including ongoing community clean-up events and a collaboration with Dad's Matter on June 30th, in which fathers were honored and many backpacks were donated to local students.

D. CITY DEPARTMENT REPORTS

1. **Code Enforcement:** Eric Tlilayatzi reported that HB Code Enforcement joined HB Police Department in a town hall meeting on May 22 at Oak View Family Resource Center. Topics included gang activity and vandalism in the neighborhood.
2. **Community Services Department:** Chris Slama reported that the City received \$40,000 in CDBG funding to support the Oak View after school program for fiscal year 2018/2019. He thanked and commended Children's Bureau and Boys and Girls Club staff for the efforts to enhance quality of life in the Oak View area.
3. **Office of Business Development:** Robert Ramirez reported that all MOU's for 2018/2019 fiscal year CDBG grant funding have been disseminated.
4. **Library Services:** Claudia Locke thanked Mariners Church for recently beautifying the front of the Library, and expressed ongoing concern of impacted parking in the area. She reported on education classes taught by

UCI covering environmental topics and energy efficiency. Locke discussed the conclusion of this year's homework club, which hosted 300 children, and citizenship classes are will start June 25. She also announced upcoming summer activities, including reading and math programs in collaboration with the local school districts.

5. **Police:** None

6. **Public Works:** Deborah Jubinsky addressed one of the issues expressed by Johansen regarding an overgrown tree, and stated that work requests have been opened for both tree maintenance and concrete repair. Jubinsky stated that illegal dumping service requests have decreased, and Public Works continues to inform residents and property owners regarding proper dumping procedures. Discussion ensued regarding appropriate refuse service levels at different properties.
