3. **Office of Business Development:** Denise Bazant introduced City staffer, Robert Ramirez, as well as employees from two property management companies; Pinnacle and Jamboree. She also reported that the City Council would be holding a joint study session to allocate CDBG funds.
4. **Library Services:** Claudia Locke summarized various upcoming programs such as a story time, HB Reads, and an after-school program to teach kids about energy efficiency in a hands-on and exciting manner. More information for all programs and events can be found on the City's website.

7. **City Manager's Office:** Antonia Graham reported that the installation of LED street lights throughout the City is complete. She introduced Dr. Jack Brouwer and Robert Flores to discuss UC Irvine's Advanced Energy Community Project Update.
