PRIVATE SECURITY FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS – OFFICER DERIK LINK, IVK9 SPECIALISTS:

Presentation by Rick Towne – Mr. Towne discussed opportunities for the various school districts to partner with private canine security firms to enhance school safety. Mr. Towne demonstrated various contraband retrieval techniques with a trained Belgian Milionis. Lengthy discussion ensued about the various ways these dogs may assist schools/districts in enhancing school safety and in identifying and locating narcotics and other contraband on school property.
