**POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT:** – Chief Handy reported on:

- Report on the shooting incident that occurred at the 7- Eleven store near Marina High school and commended the staff at Marina High for their efforts in locking down the campus during the incident.

**COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT REPORT:** – Slama reported on:

- Thanked HBUHSD for continued usage of Marina and Edison pools during the summer months. Over 1,800 swimmers, ages 6 months to adult, registered in lessons. An average of 700 swimmers per week enjoyed open recreational swim times at the high school pools as well.
- Swim instructors are certified through American Red Cross Water Safety program.
- The summer season also provides excellent job opportunities for students, and several staff which are students within in the HBUHSD.
- Sports update: over 230 youth are participating in volleyball and soccer in the fall season.
  - Competitive indoor volleyball league is held at the City Gym & Pool. This league is for boys and girls, grades 3-8.
  - PeeWee and Junior Soccer is held on the artificial turf field at the Central Park Sports Complex. This is a non-competitive, instructional program for youth, ages 3 to 8 years.

Dominguez reported on various development projects including the recently completed Worthy Park reconfiguration project adjacent to Huntington Beach High School, the

upcoming Murdy Park multi-use practice sports field and playground equipment inventory list staff is preparing to prioritize replacement.
