JANUARY DONATION UPDATE

The Huntington Beach Neighborhood Watch Program (HBNW) **fiscal year** is from July 1 to June 30 each year. We have estimated we will need approximately \$25,000 this year to cover the various HBNW program expenses which include, but are not limited to, newsletter assembly, distribution costs, returned postage, mailing labels, etc. Although many of you have requested to receive your newsletter electronically to help defray some of our expenses, we still have about the same number of newsletters being mailed out each month. While we are fortunate to say this is because of new members, we still have 5 months remaining in our fiscal year and to date we have received **\$11,001.95 in donations and newsletter advertisements-- we still need to collect \$13,998.05** by June 30, 2012.

The HBNW Board thanks all of you and our advertisers for your **support and generous donations**. We know for many of you the economy has had an effect on your household budgets and you have truly made a sacrifice with your contribution. We cannot thank you enough. But with only 5 months remaining and less than half the donations needed to meet our expenses we find it necessary to ask, if you have not already made a donation and have the means to, please consider doing so. Any amount is appreciated. Huntington Beach has over 200,000 residents; if everyone could donate just \$1.00 or \$2.00 we would more than meet our goal and have a surplus.

A \$6 donation pays for each subscriber's distribution costs; a \$10 donation helps with these costs and other needed expenses and puts your name in the Newsletter as a contributor; and a \$25 or more donation accomplishes the above, plus you will receive a HBNW sticker and a token of appreciation. Remember, HBNW is a non-profit organization; **donations are tax deductible.**

As a resident of the city, we encourage you to review the HBNW program budget and expenses.

NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

(Federal Trade Commission)

Scammers have been making phone calls claiming to represent the National Do Not Call Registry. The calls claim to provide an opportunity to sign up for the Registry. These calls are not coming from the Registry or the Federal Trade Commission and you should not respond to these calls. To add your number to the Registry you can call 888-382-1222 from the phone you wish to register, or go to www.donotcall.gov and click on “Register a Phone Number” in the left column of the page.

Your registration will not expire. Telephone numbers placed on the National Do Not Call Registry will remain on it permanently due to the Do-Not-Call Improvement Act of 2007, which became law in February 2008. Read more about it at <http://www.ftc.gov/opa/2008/04/dncfyi.shtm>.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT THE NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

The National Do Not Call Registry gives you a choice about whether to receive telemarketing calls at home. Most telemarketers should not call your number once it has been on the registry for 31 days. If they do, you can file a complaint at this Website. You can register your home or mobile phone for free. If you are an exempt organization, and you wish to scrub your call lists, you may subscribe, but are not required to do so.

Para inscribir su número de teléfono con el Registro usted puede llamar al 1-888-382-1222 utilizando el teléfono que quiere inscribir o haga www.donotcall.gov por “Inscribe Un Número Telefónico” en la columna a la izquierda de esta página web.

Su Registro no expirará. Números de teléfono en el Registro Nacional No-Llame permanecerán permanentemente debido al Acto de Mejora No-Llame de 2007, que se hizo ley en Febrero de 2008. Lea más

LO QUE USTED DEBE SABER SOBRE EL REGISTRO NACIONAL "NO LLAME"

El Registro Nacional "No Llame" le da la opción encuanto a recibir las llamadas de telemarketing en su casa. La mayoría de los telemarcaderes no deberían llamar a su número telefónico si éste ha sido inscrito en el Registro Nacional No Llame. Usted puede inscribir gratuitamente el número de su hogar, o el de su teléfono portátil gratuitamente. Si usted representa a una organización que está exenta, y desea cotejar sus listas de llamadas, puede suscribirse pero no está obligado a hacerlo.

Huntington Beach Police Department in partnership with Orange County Crime Stoppers *(Huntington Beach PD)*

Orange County Crime Stoppers encourages members of the community to assist local law enforcement agencies in the fight against crime by overcoming the two key elements that inhibit community involvement: fear and apathy.

Crime Stoppers provides a telephone number and Web Tips to encourage citizens in the community to volunteer vital information helpful to law enforcement agencies to fight against crime.

Any information sent assures the anonymity of the tipster so there is no fear of reprisal or hard feelings among friends or family members. This new way of crime fighting is all due to Crime Stoppers coming to Orange County.

There are more than 300 Crime Stoppers organizations in the United States and over 1,400 worldwide. This program has proven to be an asset to any community, with over 850,000 arrests made, over 1.2 million crimes cleared, and \$8 billion in property and drugs recovered in the last 33 years. Police departments in Orange County, including the Huntington Beach Police Department, have partnered with Crime Stoppers.

The anonymity of tipsters is guaranteed because calls are received at a Call Center using a toll free number: 1-855-TIPS-OCCS. All phone lines are encrypted and no phone calls are ever recorded. Tips are then sent on to OC Crime Stoppers for further evaluation.

Tips sent by e-mail have unique integrated Two-Way Dialog capabilities that allow the tipster to go back and

and provide additional information to the tip at any time, as well as provide a secure means for the coordinator to ask questions of the tipster through the same secure and encrypted interface. This is just the beginning of a new way for the public to join the fight against crime and it will hopefully mean the end of many a criminal.

ELDER ABUSE AND FINANCIAL EXPLOITATION



What is Financial Abuse?

Financial abuse or exploitation is the illegal or improper use of another individual's resources for personal profit and gain. Also referred to as fiduciary abuse, economic abuse, or financial mistreatment, it encompasses a broad range of conduct, and may include:

- Scams
- Theft of money, property or identity
- Failure to provide agreed upon services
- Refusal to return borrowed money or property
- Exercise of undue influence

Statistics suggest that approximately 65,000 reported incidents of financial exploitation occur each year in California. It is estimated that many additional cases are never reported because the victim is embarrassed, fearful of reprisal, or still dependent on the abuser.

How Can I Protect Myself From Financial Exploitation?

- ✓ Don't allow yourself to become socially isolated. Social isolation increases your risk of becoming a victim, so make sure you have regular outside contacts with friends and family.
- ✓ Avoid internet, telemarketing, or door-to-door solicitations. Offers of prizes and special deals are often scams. If it seems too good to be true, it probably is.
- ✓ If you need help in your home, make sure the agency you use does background checks on all staff. If hiring directly, be sure to investigate thoroughly.
- ✓ Use direct deposit for your checks.
- ✓ Shred all documents containing personal information with a cross-cut shredder.
- ✓ Check your bank statements and credit card statements monthly for unauthorized activity.
- ✓ Keep ATM and other PIN numbers and passwords **secure**.
- ✓ Report suspected crimes. If you believe you may have been the victim of financial abuse, or you know someone who has, contact your local police or call the APS (Adult Protective Services) Elder Abuse Hotline at (877) 477-3646.






