Huntington Beach to Hold Special City Council Meeting Thurs., April 18 for the Proposed Navigation Center *Meeting will start at 4pm this Thursday to discuss and vote on the proposed Navigation Center*

Why: The City of Huntington Beach will hold a special City Council meeting to consider purchasing property at 15311 Pipeline Lane for the purpose of operating a Navigation Center.

When: Thursday, April 18, at 4 p.m.

Where: Huntington Beach City Hall, 2000 Main Street in Council Chambers (lower level of City Hall). The public is welcome to attend and there will be time for public comments.

Who: Federal lawsuits were filed last year against the County of Orange, and nine other cities, for the lack of emergency shelter beds for homeless individuals. The City has diligently evaluated nearly 30 potential properties. On April 2, 2019, the City met with Federal Judge, David O. Carter, to propose a new plan to obtain a building. The revised location for the proposed Center was well received by the Court. The City has also hosted two Open Houses, on April 9 and April 13, to address local business and community concerns.

What: The proposed Center will provide beds for adult men, women, and couples. There will be an approval process for potential clients. Clients living at the Navigation Center will obtain needed services such as health care, counseling, job training, and more. Clients will be driven to and from the site and there will be no "walk-ins" or "walk-outs." The Center will have strict security guidelines to ensure the safety of the community.

Next Zoning Administrator Public Hearing is Wednesday, April 17

Time: 1:30 PM

Where: City Hall, Lower Level, Room B-8

The Zoning Administrator will hold a public hearing and consider the following items submitted to the Community Development Department for approval:

Flashpoint Brewing Company has submitted a conditional use permit (CUP No. 19-011) application to open a brewery and tasting room at 7302 Autopark Drive (north of Ellis Avenue, west of Gothard Street). The proposed microbrewery will occupy approx. 3,000 square feet including a proposed 560 square foot tasting room.



AT&T Wireless has submitted conditional use permit applications (CUP Nos. 19-008 & 19-009) to install small cell wireless communication facilities on existing wood utility poles in the public right-of-way. One utility pole is located on the south side of Heil Avenue, approx. 265 linear feet west of the centerline of Goldenwest Street. The other utility pole is located on Gothard Street, 116 linear feet south of Heil Avenue.

Raising Cane's Chicken Fingers Restaurant has requested a conditional use permit (CUP No. 18-045) to construct a drive through restaurant with an outdoor patio area located at 10142 Adams Avenue (in the Stater Bros. shopping center next to Woody's Diner).

Sprint Wireless requested a conditional use permit (CUP No. 18-037) for construction of a 60 ft. high monopalm located in the Holly Seacliff industrial area south of Garfield Avenue, west of Stewart Lane.

One other scheduled item, a request to conduct exploratory archeological work on the vacant Windward Specific Plan site located at Bolsa Chica Street and Los Patos, is proposed to be continued to another meeting date.

Huntington Beach Police Officers Honored

This past week, members of the Huntington Beach Police Department were rewarded for their outstanding efforts in taking impaired drivers off the streets of our community. Each year, Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) holds an awards ceremony for officers who exhibit exemplary skill in arresting people who choose to drive while impaired. This year, we celebrated four officers who went above and beyond in trying to ensure there are no more victims of impaired driving in our community.

Officer Katelyn Jordan arrested 25 people suspected of driving under the influence over the course of one year, Officer Tai Huynh (now retired and not pictured) had 51 arrests and Officer Craig Moresco had 52 arrests.

Earning the Top DUI Arresting Officer of Orange County was HBPD Officer Grant Hasselbach, who arrested 370 people during the past year! When you think about how many days there are in a year and the fact that most officers typically work four days per week, this number is incredible! Officer Hasselbach is currently assigned as our DUI Enforcement Officer, in which he specifically focuses his efforts on arresting suspects for Driving Under the Influence.

Congratulations to each of these officers for making a very real impact within our community. We are very proud of your hard work, and for the countless lives you have saved.

As part of Volunteer Appreciation Month, the Huntington Beach Fire Department's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program held their annual awards dinner on April 11 to honor the CERT volunteers for their 2018 service.

Over 60 people attended the event for food, beverages, and fun, especially with seeing each other while not in a volunteer activity. 
EASTER HUNT AND FAMILY FUN DAY 2019
